Pre-Business (PRBS) and Business Prep (BSPR) students must complete **all** general prerequisites, lower division major prerequisites **and** breadth (excluding foreign language) or IGETC **within 120 quarter units of coursework with a 2.5 CUM GPA and a 2.0 GPA in each category** to qualify to apply for the Business Administration (BSAD) major. PRBS students attend a Major Change Workshop (see www.chassstudentaffairs.ucr.edu). BSPR students must see their alpha advisor 2-3 days before their registration time block each quarter until they have successfully applied in person. Prior approval of an excess unit petition by the Assistant Dean in BSAD at Anderson Hall is required if the student will exceed 120 qu during the last quarter of prerequisite/breadth coursework. See your advisor for petitioning eligibility.

Other majors will be considered for BSPR by appointment (951-827-4551) **IF** completed 60 units or more, BSAD 20A **and** either MATH 4 or MATH 5 with "C" or better **and** with a 2.5 cum GPA.

Students will be considered for the 07F revised BUS major if graduating 09S or later and not exceeding 100 qu upon completion of breadth and pre-reqs, including ECON 102A and ECON 103A. Call Anderson Hall at 951-827-4551 for advising appointment.
