

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q: Is a C - grade repeatable?**

A: No. Only D's and F's are repeatable.

**Q: Is a C- a passing grade?**

A: Yes. Even D's are passing grades, except for FOREIGN LANGUAGE, ENGL COMP and pre-reqs to subsequent MATH courses.

NOTE: You must have a 2.0 CUM GPA and upper division (UD) BSAD GPA to graduate.

**Q: How do I calculate my UD GPA?**

A: For each 4 qu:

A	=	16.0	C	=	8.0
A -	=	14.8	C -	=	6.8
B +	=	13.2	D +	=	5.2
B	=	12.0	D	=	4.0
B -	=	10.8	D -	=	2.8
C+	=	9.2	F	=	0

Divide your QHRS (UC units) into your QPTS (UC letter grades) = GPA

NOTE: With the first 16 qu of courses you repeat, the QPTS are replaced with the last grade earned.

After 16 qu of repeats, the grades are averaged.

The units for each repeat of the same course are counted.

If you repeat the same course twice, you must petition Dr. Weber by appointment for credit.

**Q: If I satisfy all the BSAD requirements, will I automatically receive a diploma?**

A: No. You must apply to graduate on-line at [www.chassstudentaffairs.ucr.edu](http://www.chassstudentaffairs.ucr.edu) before the CHASS deadline as published in the Schedule of Classes.

You must earn a total of 180 qu; you can petition to transfer up to 10 qu in your Senior Year to satisfy the 180 qu requirement; posting deadlines in the Schedule of Classes.

You must personally order delivery of your diploma and transcripts from the Registrar (827-7284).

**Q: Can I have a minor or concentration in one of the functional areas of business?**

A: There is no concentration at UCR in business, but you can enhance your resume by taking a total of 4 UD classes in any single functional area and defining it appropriately as a concentration.

Academically at UCR, minors are approved if they are in a separate major or discipline.

**Q: How do I know if my EAP course satisfies a BSAD requirement?**

A: All UC EAP courses are transferable, including grades and units.

NO EAP course is guaranteed to be COMPARABLE to a UCR requirement until the syllabus in English is articulated by faculty upon the student's return from their actual EAP experience (**2 copies**)

Must be UPPER DIVISION to satisfy a BSAD requirement.

Must be based on PRINCIPLES & THEORY OF BUSINESS (you are not earning an ECON degree)

Must NOT be specific to the country you are visiting, but can be INTERNATIONAL PRINCIPLES & THEORY OF BUSINESS

Most OB (Organization Behavior/Industrial Psychology) courses can be used to satisfy one of the two OB requirements (OB courses can likely be found in BUS, MGT, PSYC, or SOC)

No matter how many units over 4 qu the course is, 5 SEPARATE courses are required to satisfy the 20 qu of UD BSAD electives

Before seeing your BSAD advisor, choose your country at WATKINS HOUSE and consider satisfying a Language or other Minor or taking ART, HIST or POSC courses for the cultural experience!
